To All Baguio Electric Consumers:

Baguio City Lone District Congressman Bernardo M. Vergara recently filed House Bill No.5518 for Baguio City to have its own power cooperative and provide the best service at the lowest electric rates possible, which would give a relief not only to our marginalized constituents but also to investors and businessmen.

It is high time that a separate power cooperative for Baguio City be established now as being continuously advocated by the Baguio Electric Cooperative (BAELCO) in response to the electric consumers' clamor for better services at the lowest electric rates possible, and an electric cooperative duly accredited with the Cooperative Development Authority (CDA).

The BAELCO was established in the year 2007 and since then it has continued to encourage electric consumers of Baguio City to join the entity realize the dream of electric consumers of the city.

We are, therefore, calling the attention of electric consumers of Baguio City to join hands together in putting this dream of ours to have our very own. Likewise rest assured that BENECO employees will be given a free hand to choose whether to serve BENECO or BAELCO. Even more, BENECO board members from Baguio City are most welcome to serve BAELCO. Once House Bill No. 5518 is passed by members of Congress and the Senate, a meeting of all electric consumers in the City will be invited to a general assembly to elect members for the BAELCO board. The rumors being spread around by oppositors of the establishment of a separate cooperative is entirely false. Perhaps, the oppositors to this move is to frighten BENECO employees that they will be replaced once a separate power cooperative franchise for Baguio City is passed.

The granting of the legislative franchise to BAELCO will surely be a giant step that would signal the birth of Baguio City owning its electric and power cooperative — a real and genuine electric and power cooperative duly registered with CDA.

Lastly, we congratulate and express our deepest thanks to Congressman Bernardo M. Vergara for introducing House Bill No. 5518 in Congress.

in Asia and the Philippines. It belongs to the grass family, a cereal grain that is eaten as boiled grain. It grows in shallow water, in a warm, wet climate. Planting is done by hand and involves 4 steps: 1. Preparing the ground by plowing, then adding mineral fertilizers to enrich the soil, before planting. 2. Planting by sowing or transplanting seedlings to a flooded field by the 15 farmhands they have hired, paying them Php250.00 per day. Their rice variety of “124” is planted in June-July-August as rainy season is ideal for planting rice. 3. Controlling disease and pests is important for a good rice crop. Weeds and insect pests are eliminated by careful application of fertilizers. 4. After 3 months of growth, Rice is harvested, and then undergoes a process of drying before storage and milling.

In their irrigated riceland, the Ngateg Family harvested one ton or 120 cavans of “124” palay or 60 cavans of milled rice. In hulling or removing unwanted materials in the rice grains, bran layers are removed (for feeds of chicken and pigs as they have poultry and piggery projects as well. After milling, the rice grains are graded and checked for damaged kernels. They are packed for sale or picked up by buyers. To recycle the nutrients of the soil, corn is planted after rice harvest, in December to April.

The Yellow Corn variety for livestock feeds is grown during summertime. They have a bigger sale from corn as these are planted twice a year. Assisted by her daughter Erlinda Gamayan, management of marketing the products are properly recorded when dealers pick up the produce. Their corn which is used as feeds for livestock, called “silage”, is Yellow and White grains that are grinded, dried and used as feeds.

Mrs. Leonida Ngateg is also trying her skills at duck-raising. In a corner of the farm is a cool pond, supplied by water pumps; there are ten (10) male and ten (10) female ducks to start the project. Duck-raising can be profitable because they are more resistant to disease than chicken. With the offshoot-product, the balut is a highly nutritious delicacy. Some ducks are raised commercially for their eggs and meat like the “itik” and the “bibí”, which are plump with yellow skin. *References: Livelihood Technology Kit 2002 and Mrs. Leonida Ngateg, BARP Member.*

DIWA Partylist Christmas Gathering

DIWA Partylist coalition member together with Rep. Emmeline Y. Aglipay, General Edgar B. Aglipay (ret.) Chairman DIWA Partylist and his wife; Col. Manuel Briones, Secretary General of DIWA Partylist; Atty. Francis Ballesteros, Chief of Staff of Rep. Aglipay and other staff jointly celebrated its 2011 Christmas held at the Yan Museum, Ortigas, Pasay City last December 16, 2011.

Likewise, in the same gathering, the coalition board members of DIWA partylist discussed development of their respective programs being undertaken and funded by Rep. Emmeline Y. Aglipay's Priority Development Assistance Fund (PDAF) covering livelihood, infrastructure, medical assistance and scholarship program. Several issues were discussed more particularly on the difficulties confronting each coalition Board Member in different parts of the country. Most controversial is the continuing difficulties being experienced by them particularly in the release and use of PDAF for livelihood and infrastructure projects. With respect to the slow release of funds for its various projects, along this line, General Aglipay had instructed, Rep. Aglipay to call the attention of concern agencies like regional CDA and provincial and/or City Engineering District, DPWH to fasttrack release of PDAF allocated to its various funded projects in the different parts of the country.

Even more, the Chairman of DIWA partylist informed the coalition Board members that the allocation of PDAF of Rep. Emmeline Y. Aglipay will be governed by the number of member registered by the coalition member organization of DIWA Partylist. This means that the greater the number of registered voters enrolled as members to the coalition member organization, the bigger the PDAF allocation to be provided them. Immediately after the sumptuous Christmas lunch at the Yan Museum, gifts from Gen. Edgar B. Aglipay and DIWA family were distributed to all the staff, encoders and coalition board members. This was followed by the encoders' training on how to operate the laptops provided to each of them, particularly on the registration of regular voters as members to the DIWA partylist.
